

New website!

On May 6, 2021, the newly reorganized and remodeled **mrcpl.org** website was launched to the public. The site offers new features like improved screen size adaptability, highly organized search menus, and more efficient access to information and materials provided by the Library. The new event calendar is color-coded by age group and can be filtered by several other categories making it much easier for patrons to find and register for our engaging programs.



Back to "Normal"

Following a year of periodic closures and restrictions due to safety concerns during the COVID-19 pandemic, in August 2021, MRCPL was excited to announce to the public the return of in-person programming and the return of some one-on-one services. In addition, Sunday hours were resumed in September at the Main Library and the Ontario Branch.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS A YEAR IN REVIEW

Hours Increase

To provide patrons with increased opportunities to visit our locations, the Board agreed to add one hour of service to the four smallest MRCPL branches. As of April 16, 2021, the Butler, Crestview, Lucas, and Plymouth branches now open at 9 AM Monday through Saturday. The response from the community has been positive.

Career Online High School

The Career Online High School (COHS) gives adult students a chance to earn an accredited high school diploma and a career certificate completely online. On April 28, 2021, MRCPL celebrated our first graduate of the program with a small ceremony. Additional students are currently active in the program and working toward their certificates.

Free Meals for Kids

MRCPL partnered with the Children's Hunger Alliance to offer free, nutritious, shelf-stable meals for children ages 2-18. The program began at the Main Library and grew to include meal distribution at the Butler, Madison, and Plymouth branches with total distribution of 4,330 meals in five months.

3D Printing

The Learning Lab at the Main Library hosts a 3D Printer. In 2021, the Lab staff introduced several new class opportunities for card holders to learn more about this innovative machine. In addition, card holders can now submit projects to be printed by MRCPL staff at a minimal charge.

Library of Things

The Library's collection of non-traditional materials saw continued growth in 2021 with the addition of puzzles, sewing machines, and musical instruments. The established collections increased as well, providing patrons with more opportunities for learning and engagement.

Freegal

Freegal® Music was added as a digital resource for patrons in November of 2021. This service allows patrons to access a collection spanning over 15 million songs, music videos, and audiobooks from more than 40.000 music labels worldwide. Freegal® Music offers library card holders an easy-to-use and enjoyable listening experience.



BOOKMOBILE

On May 19, 2021, MRCPL hosted a ribbon-cutting to launch the new Bookmobile and introduce it to the community. We then embarked upon a branch tour to acquaint our library employees and customers with this exciting new resource. During this inaugural year, the Outreach staff has grown and the Bookmobile has been highly visible throughout Richland County. We added 12 regular stops to our calendar and are finding new places to visit each month. We've also driven in parades and popped up at many community events. To date, we have circulated over 3,000 items and are building our collection to meet the needs of our customers.

COVID-19 Test Kits

The Ohio Department of Health asked public libraries to play a critical role in distributing at-home, self-administered COVID-19 testing kits to Ohio residents. As a library partner, MRCPL distributed over 8,000 kits.




